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
2020 YEAR IN REVIEW

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

COMPACT experienced a year of reimagining and growth in 2020. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic that affected not only our community but our world, COMPACT reimagined the 2020 programs and continued to focus on growing a robust, diverse and work ready talent pipeline through an integrated network of employers, educators, and community resources.

In June, COMPACT welcomed two AmeriCorps VISTA members to the team, with the goal to increase capacity and sustainability through community engagement and resource development. In July, COMPACT launched a new website and pivoted our Becoming BN program to virtual panel discussions emphasizing the benefits of the Bloomington-Normal community to summer interns, graduate students, and early career professionals. In November and December, we hosted Education to Employer Virtual RoundTable Discussions in lieu of the in-person Education to Employer Summits.

While this year was like no other, our COMPACT Board and volunteers aided countless times in the planning and implementation of this year's programs. With their support, we hosted three new or reimagined programs, created a marketing and outreach plan to increase our organizational reach, and began building a social networking presence on LinkedIn.



In 2021 COMPACT will continue to build increased community collaboration with our programs and serve as a resource for employers, educators and individuals in our community. 2020 COMPACT Committees:

ENGAGEMENT COMMITTEE – Focuses on employer, education, and community engagement. The Engagement Committee leads efforts to assess employer needs, assists with promotion and marketing of COMPACT designated programs, leads efforts to increase the number of employer exposure opportunities to students and increase in-school connections.

PROGRAM COMMITTEE - Focuses on assessing current programs and identifying potential future programming opportunities. The Program Committee provides oversight and guidance for our current portfolio of programs, identifies where additional programming or partnerships could be beneficial to grow a robust, diverse, and work ready talent pipeline, and identifies COMPACT endorsed initiatives or programs in McLean County.

EVALUATION COMMITTEE – Focuses on analyzing COMPACT's efforts and evaluating progress towards identified goals and objectives. The Evaluation Committee leads efforts to establish "baseline" data points for COMPACT to assess success against while updating and maintaining local modules and key performance indicators.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Focuses on oversight of COMPACT's financial resources, operational structure, and board development. The Governance Committee assists with diversifying and stabilizing COMPACT's funding streams, assists with review and implementation of policies and procedures for sustained operational structure, and leads efforts to identify and recruit COMPACT Board members.

Becoming BN is a program designed to introduce early career, summer interns, and grad students to the wonderful attributes of the Bloomington Normal community. The program was piloted in 2019 as a way to showcase community events and provide professional and social networking opportunities.

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, Becoming BN for the Summer of 2020 consisted of four (4) virtual events that exposed participants to panel discussions from local leaders, young professionals and CEO's from local employers. Virtual sessions were conducted weekly over the noon hour throughout July. Session topics included a Young Professional Panel and "chats" with leaders in Technology, Health & Recreation, and Food & Beverage.

In 2020, the Education to Employer Summits were reimagined into a series of roundtable discussions via Zoom to continue creating conversations across the academic and business sectors during the pandemic and beyond. The purpose of the roundtables was to increase outcome-based collaboration through the creation of actionable steps to develop a robust, diverse, and work-ready talent pipeline. The main questions asked were: "What are your needs and where should we as a community focus our efforts?" COMPACT plans to continue these roundtable discussions in 2021. AmeriCorps VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America) members build capacity in nonprofit organizations and public agencies to help them more effectively generate the commitment of private sector resources, encourage volunteer service at the local level, and empower individuals and communities. AmeriCorps AmeriCorps VISTA members serve full time for 1 full year at a community organization on anti-poverty projects. AmeriCorps VISTA members work on projects that build the capacity of their organization.

The goal of COMPACT's VISTA Project is to support McLean County's overarching goal to have 60% of the population with a postsecondary credential by 2025 while focusing on equitable access to success. The VISTA project will increase COMPACT's ability to serve more people and new populations, while also expanding the types of workforce development services provided. VISTA resources will move people out of poverty by addressing two factors that can lead individuals to poverty, employment and education.

60 BY 25 NETWORK



McLean County Community COMPACT is part of the 60 by 25 Network that is designed to meet the needs of communities that are working together to provide rigorous, real world learning in and out of the classroom. A coalition led by Advance Illinois, Illinois Student Assistance Commission, and the Education Systems Center at Northern Illinois University has come together to create a community of practice to help local and regional teams accelerate progress toward the goal of ensuring that 60% of all adults have a college or career credential by 2025.

Under this Network, COMPACT had received funding for the College and Careers Pathway Endorsement Project. Working with Heartland Community College, Bloomington Public School-District 87, McLean County-Unit 5, Olympia School Districts and the Bloomington Area Career Center the project has focused on "identifying a sequence of courses extending from high school into postsecondary education and undertake curriculum alignment addressing the career-focused instruction component of endorsement" in endorsement areas of Heath Science, Information Technology and Agriculture. The project led a visit to School District 214 in Arlington Heights, IL early in 2019 to explore how District 87 has utilized project/work based learning programs and utilized partnerships with local employers.
